



Affordances

- > "The affordances of the environment are what it offers the animal, what it provides or furnishes, either for good or ill." James J. Gibson, 1979
- "... the properties of an object or features of an environment that suggest to us how it is to be used." Sarah Williams Goldhagen, 2017
- > Implies a relationship between the animal and the environment
- > Examples:

Seat walls, cushions, furniture



Action Settings

> Three Components:

- Person
- Environment
- Social Context
- Action spaces as predictors of children's behavior (Roger Barker)

Patterned arrangement and social context (Sarah Williams Goldhagen)



Action Settings Questions to Consider

Sarah Williams Goldhagen's criteria for how we engage with a particular place:

- > How does it facilitate human activities and the correspondence among those activities?
- > What is the preferred arrangement of objects in space?
- > What associations do the place's forms elicit?










